You may know that our mother suffered a massive stroke on 20-July, and died on 26-July.

If you haven't been informed of this event, please accept our deepest sympathies on having to receive such sad news. The delay in this communication is due in part to the tragic death our brother, Nick, which took place on 9-August during our period of grief over our mother's death.
